In 2024, Ukrainian American House (UA House) provided vital support to over 180 Ukrainian refugees, assisting them in their transition to a new life after fleeing the war.

Recognizing the complexities of settling in a new country, UA House offered both immediate and long-term assistance to refugees and immigrants.

We also bolstered two refugee programs focused on mental health and emotional wellness, as well as education support.



Services Provided:



- Public Benefits: Provided direct support for the refugees apply for various public benefits (e.g., Cash Assistance, CalFresh, Medi-Cal), troubleshooted applications, and managed
- Navigating the Healthcare System: Assisted clients with understanding and accessing healthcare, including selecting Medi-Cal plans, scheduling doctors appointments, and managing referrals. We provided personalized and culturally responsive support to help individuals overcome barriers to care, connect to needed services and assist in navigating complex medical system. **Resource Connection**: Participants received assistance in accessing vital community resources, including housing assistance, food security, and healthcare services. Our team provided information and referrals to local organizations tailored to meet specific needs.
- Legal Documents: Provided direct assistance with immigration paperwork (e.g., Work Authorization, Social Security applications, Reparole requests, and Temporary Protected Status (TPS) documentation.,) educating and guiding clients through the application process, and ensuring they understand each step).
- Translation Services: Assisted with translation needs for legal documents and provided bilingual support throughout the application process. • Career Guidance: Helped refugees become selfsufficient by offering resume support, job preparation, and guidance toward high-demand employment opportunities.
- Community Events & Giveaways: We helped support and plan several community events for Ukrainian refugees to attend and engage in, including recreational events and gift giveaways.




Launched in 2024 and funded by the Public Health Institute, Care4U program at UA House is dedicated to empowering individuals and families facing various life challenges. Our mission is to provide essential mental health resources and professional psychological support that foster wellbeing and resilience.

Our Services:

- One-on-one counseling with Ukrainian peer counselors: The program offers professional mental health support through individual and group therapy, focusing on emotional and psychological needs to help participants navigate personal challenges in the new environment.
- Group sessions: Care4U delivers workshops and training sessions designed to equip individuals with essential life skills. We facilitate peer-led support groups where individuals can share experiences and find encouragement. These groups create a safe space for discussing challenges and developing coping strategies.
- **Resources to help reduce stress:** Participants in the Care4U program have access to a variety of resources designed to reduce stress and promote overall well-being. This includes: Useful Articles, Mindfulness and Relaxation Techniques, Support Materials (Access to brochures and online resources that provide tips and strategies for managing stress effectively).
- Licensed counselors referrals: For individuals needing more specialized support, the Care4U program offers referrals to licensed Ukrainian and American counselors. This ensures that participants receive comprehensive care tailored to their unique experiences and cultural background. Our aim is to connect individuals with qualified professionals who can provide the additional mental health support necessary for their well-being and adjustment to a new environment.

Refugee Education Support





In 2024, UA House launched a program dedicated to helping families adjust to life in the U.S. through quality education. Recognizing the challenges of adapting to a new country, our initiative provides essential resources to support both parents and children in navigating the U.S. education system.





- This year, we continued our partnership with the UA English Club, focusing on creating positive change by connecting volunteers with Ukrainian children in need. Through volunteer teaching, we empower individuals to share their knowledge and support, making a meaningful impact on young learners.
- Designed to transcend borders, the UA English Club facilitates connections between global volunteers and children unable to attend school. By providing engaging educational experiences filled with kindness and fun, we aim to uplift spirits and enhance learning during challenging times. This collaboration underscores the power of community in transforming lives through education.

- Basic Needs Support: Resources for mental health, healthcare navigation, public benefits, legal documentation, and basic needs.

As part of California's State Listos initiative, our emergency preparedness program is dedicated to equipping refugees with the essential knowledge and resources to navigate emergencies confidently and effectively.

In 2024, the Listos program made significant strides in enhancing emergency preparedness among refugees in Sacramento.

We have successfully **reached 25,000 Ukrainian and Russian speaking immigrants**, providing them with essential knowledge and resources to navigate emergencies effectively.

The program offered a series of well-attended training sessions **conducted in Ukrainian**, **Russian, and English**, ensuring that participants **received valuable information** in a language they understood. These workshops focused on various topics, including disaster response, safety protocols, and personal preparedness strategies.

Community awareness campaigns further engaged the Ukrainian and Russian speaking immigrant population, spreading important information and fostering a culture of preparedness. The collaborative efforts among local organizations and volunteers helped create a supportive environment, ensuring that refugees felt empowered and informed.

National Multi-subject Testing (NMT) for Displaced Ukrainian Students

June 1st

For the third consecutive year,

temporarily displaced Ukrainian high school graduates have been given a unique opportunity to take the Ukrainian National Multi-Subject Test remotely in Sacramento at UA House, organized by Ukrainian American House in partnership with the Consulate General of Ukraine in San Francisco, Ukrainian School in Sacramento and Math Club with the support of the Ukrainian community.

Two test sessions were offered, both in the first week of June - June 1 and June 4, 2024. A total of 38 students took the NMT in Sacramento this year.

In 2024, applicants for Bachelor's Degree program (Master's Degree program in medicine) have to pass the National Multi-subject Test (NMT) in order to apply for higher educational institutions in Ukraine with the aim of returning to Ukraine promoting its restoration in the social, economic and cultural spheres.



COLLABORATION WITH #WakeUp





As part of our Care4U program, we have successfully **initiated a collaboration with the #WakeUp Project** in September, 2024. This partnership is established with the objective of enhancing both physical and mental well-being among participants through a series of free Saturday morning group training sessions and subsequent community gatherings.

The **#WakeUp Project** is making significant strides globally, with operations in various cities across Ukraine, Europe, and key locations in the United States, including Miami, Arlington, Orlando, Sacramento, and Los Angeles. This extensive reach underscores the project's commitment to connecting with diverse communities and creating a meaningful impact worldwide. Through this partnership, we aspire to enhance individual well-being and strengthen the fabric of our community.

Our dual-focus approach aims to achieve the following objectives:

Improve Physical Health: We provide a range of structured fitness sessions tailored to accommodate varying fitness levels, thereby promoting regular exercise and improving overall physical health.



Enhance Mental Health: Our initiative is designed to foster a supportive environment that prioritizes mental wellness. Through these collective actions, the Support Ukraine Initiative made a meaningful impact, fostering community engagement and solidarity with the Ukrainian people throughout 2024.



Helping Paws is an initiative of Ukrainian American House, in partnership with Humane Society International (HSI) responding to the pet crisis in Ukraine. Together, we have established a distribution network to move large quantities of pet food directly to the pet shelters who need it the most.

In 2024, UA House supported a number of medical and humanitarian aid supply deliveries in Ukraine.

We have successfully sponsored the delivery of a vital shipments of medical vehicles to Ukraine in April and September, which have now arrived and is actively serving on the frontlines in Eastern Ukraine.

In light of that tragic event, Ukrainian American House launched a fundraising initiative to **support Okhmatdyt Hospital** during that critical time. All donations received directly benefited the hospital, with 100% of funds going towards rebuilding efforts, medical supplies, and support for the hospital staff who continued to bravely serve amidst the chaos.




Ukrainian **Children's** Books


The forced mass exodus of Ukrainian citizens abroad following the Russian aggression has had a significant impact on the interest of foreigners in learning the Ukrainian language. Within a few months, the language has become one of the most popular European languages, leading to a considerable increase in its global rating.

The significance of learning the Ukrainian language goes beyond just a trend. It is a reflection of the desire to embrace and carry forward Ukrainian culture and values. By learning the language, individuals can gain a deeper understanding of the country's rich heritage, traditions, and customs. Furthermore, it represents a means of self-identification as a Ukrainian, and an opportunity to connect with the vibrant Ukrainian community both within the country and abroad. That is why we supported the printing and distribution of almost 20,000 books in the U.S. and in Poland.



The forum served as a **vital platform for** collaboration and innovation, aiming to drive economic growth and foster sustainable development in Ukraine.



Advocate for Critical Aid Petition on Change.org

Russia's continual aggression against Ukraine is a direct threat to global security. After the US House failed to vote on aid for Ukraine in March of 2024, the urgency of the situation prompted Ukrainian American House (UA House) to launch a petition on Change.org - "Support Ukraine Now: Advocate for Critical Aid".

This initiative quickly gained traction, **amassing over 35,000 signatures**, underscoring the widespread recognition that support for Ukraine is not merely humanitarian assistance but a vital investment in global justice, security, and peace. The petition reflects a growing awareness that aiding Ukraine is crucial for stability not only within its borders but also in the broader international community.



Meeting with Congressman Kevin Kiley


On August 28, 2024, Ukrainian American House, in collaboration with the Sunflower Society, met with Congressman Kevin Kiley to discuss critical issues for Ukraine. We emphasized the impending expiration of the Presidential Drawdown Authority (PDA) and the "Stand with Ukraine Act," which seeks to reaffirm U.S. support and facilitate Ukraine's NATO membership. We urged Congressman Kiley to support these initiatives and advocate for policy changes that would permit Ukraine to use U.S.-supplied weapons against legitimate military targets in Russia.
